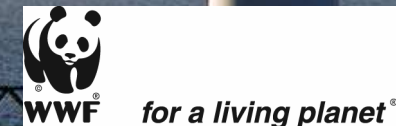

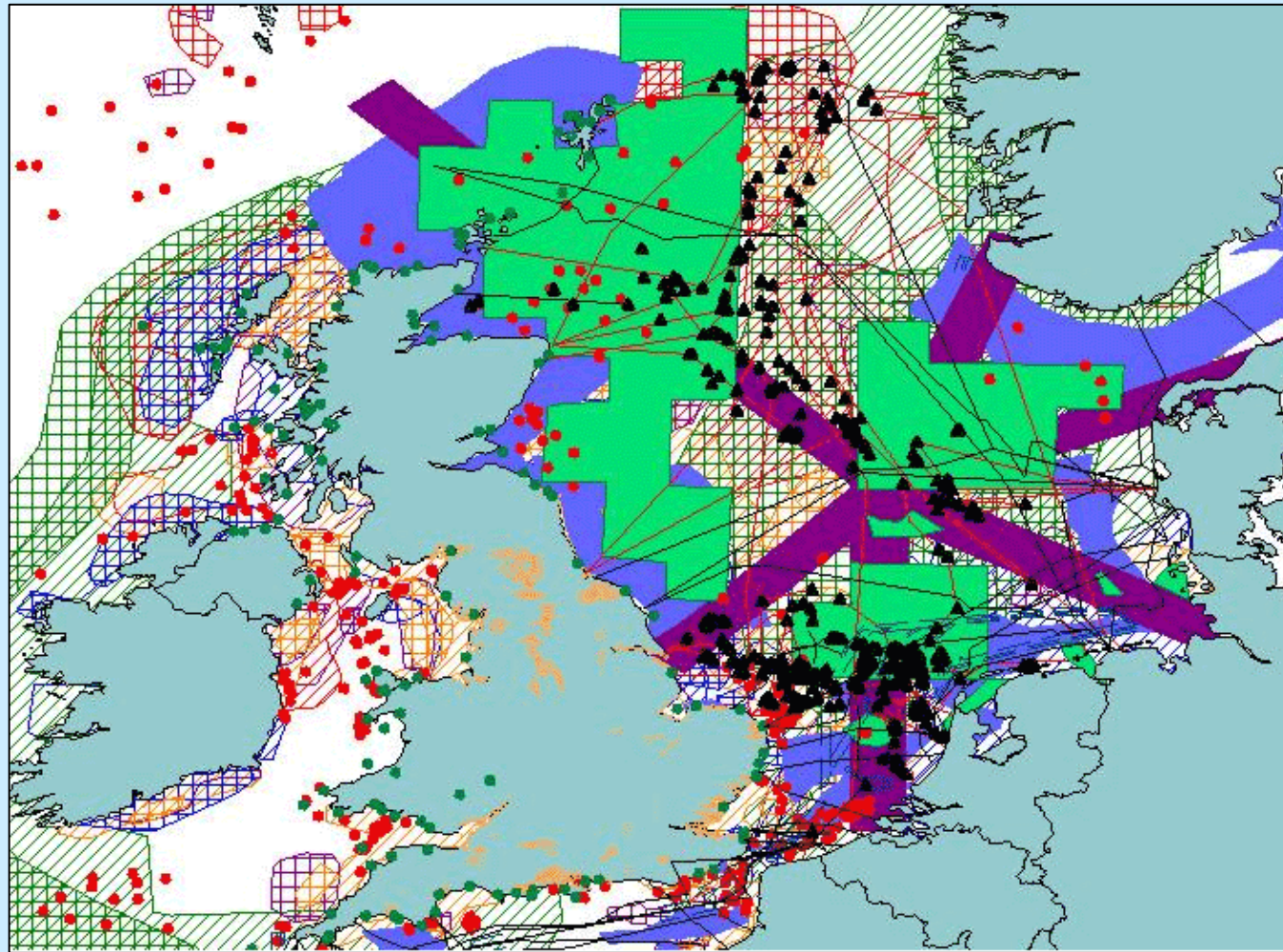
Six ways;

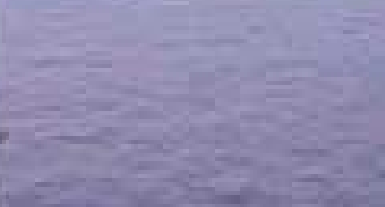
- Improving energy efficiency

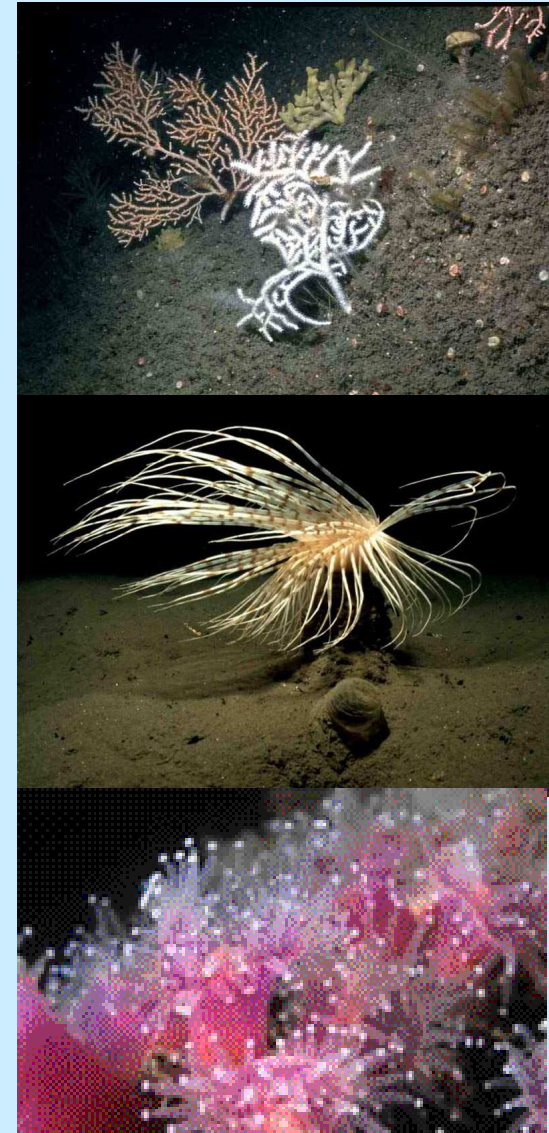
Our Busy Seas -

- Marine Biodiversity helps tackle climate change
